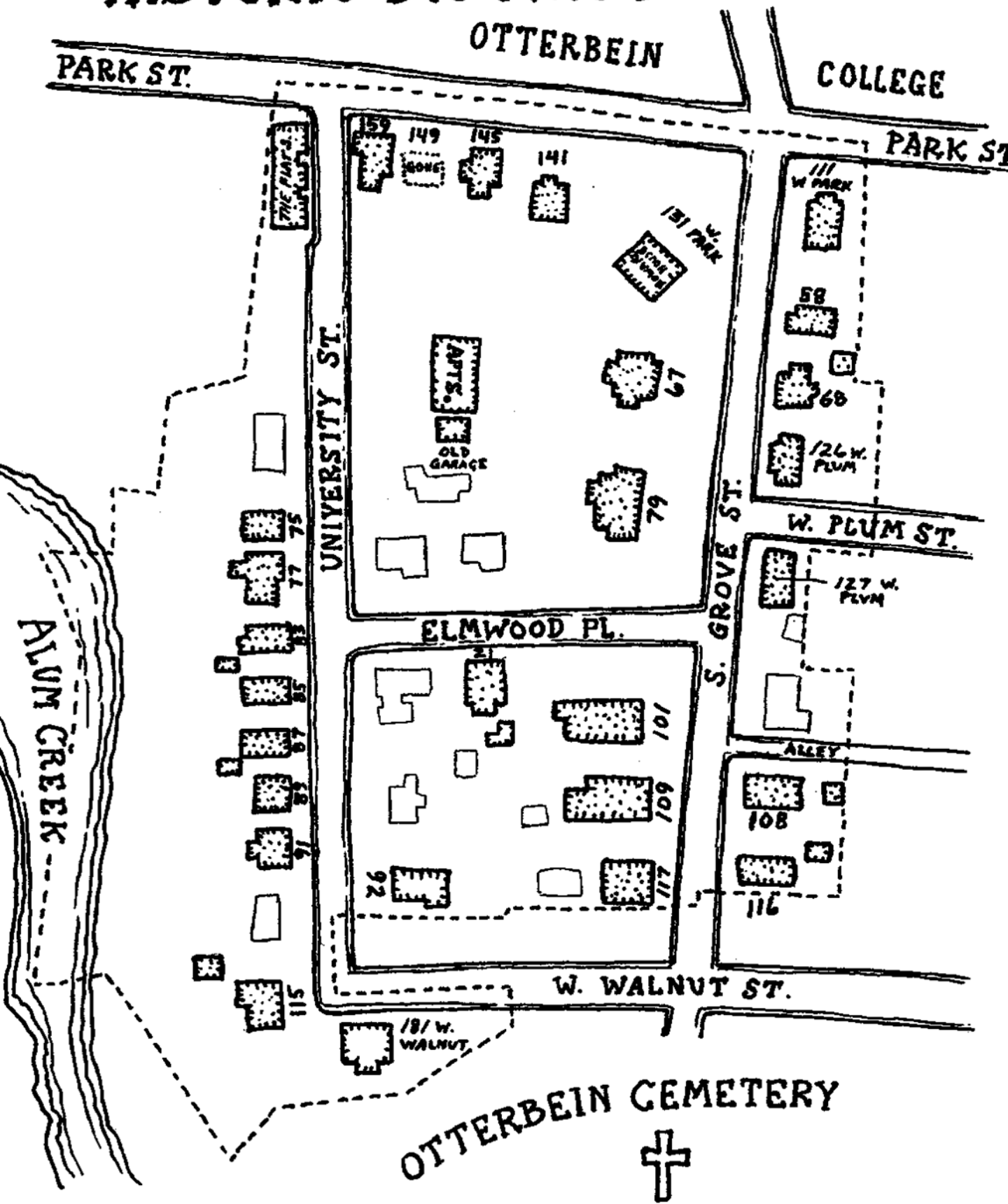


TEMPERANCE ROW HISTORIC DISTRICT

South Grove Street

- 58 Built in 1916. Home of Charles A. Dehnhoff.
- 67 Built for the Bakers, circa 1923. Lillie Baker lived here, 1924-1929.
- 68 One of the oldest residences in the district. Home of Clione Bailey, sister of Ernest Cherrington.
- 79 Built in 1910 by Howard Hyde Russell. Sold to Ernest Cherrington in 1915, who lived here 10 yrs.
- 101 Built by Milo Kelser after coming to Westerville in 1910. Worked in ASL's lecture dept. for 15 yrs.
He died in the home in 1925. His wife continued to live in Westerville, living until 1959
- 108 Built 1913 by Charles Watts, Supt of American Issue Publishing Co.
- 109 Built 1912 by Thomas Hare. He sold in 1927, repurchased in 1929.
- 116 Home of Clarence Bargdill, Temperance Row "handyman", who bought it in 1925. Lived here 4 yrs.
- 117 Built 1916. Home of Sam Fickel.

181 W. Walnut St. Built in 1914. Home of John G. Schaibly.

University Street

"The Flats" Built in 1917 by Ernest Cherrington. Six apartments in the building.

- 75 Home of Oscar Christgau for 2 yrs. Assistant superintendant of Ohio ASL under McBride

- 87 Built in 1922 by Jephtha Caris, accountant for the American Issue Publishing Co.
- 89
- 91 Paul Kelser Family lived here for a period while he served the ASL
- 92 Completed in 1920. Home of Russell A. Henderson, cartoonist for the American Issue.
- 115 Built 1915 by W.C. (Chester) Johnson. Harry Sowers, 1918-19. Walter Clippinger, 1940-1948.

West Park Street

- 111 One of the homes the Paul Kelser Family lived in.
- 131 (Howard House) Built 1910 by Purley and Lillie Baker. Called "Greendale". The Bakers lived here until 1924, when it became the ASL's library.
- 141 Cellar House, Otterbein College.
- 145 Built? Bakers lived here 2 years prior to completion of large home. Moved from corner.
- 149 Vacant lot. Original home built in 1915 razed by Otterbein in 2005. George A. Henry, Boyd Doty.
- 159 Built by Purley Baker in 1915. Home of Edward J. Moore.

21 Elmwood Place Built in 1912. Robt. W. Moran, ASL field agent, lived here from 1915-1919.

West Plum Street

- 126 Home of Rev. Charles Sowers, head of Contributions Dept. of the ASL.
- 127 One of the oldest homes in the district
